



The prevailing belief among muslims is that, because the Qur'an is the Word of God and God is eternal, it follows that His Word is also eternal. Mahmoud Hussein suggests this is not what the Qur'an says and that this becomes clear when the Qur'anic text is read within its original context.

Hussein highlights three points: first, God cannot be confused with His Word. God transcends time while His Word is inscribed within time. Second, God's Word is not a monologue but an exchange between heaven and earth. Third, God revealed different orders of truth, weaving together the absolute and the relative, the general and the particular, the eternal and the contingent. Certain revealed verses were even abrogated by God, to be replaced by others.



Mustafa Kemal Atatürk is hailed as one of the most charismatic political leaders of the twentieth-century, but little is known today about his one and only wife, Latife Hanım. A multilingual intellectual who read law at the Sorbonne, she was a suffragist who closely followed women's movements around the world.

Her marriage set her apart from her contemporaries, raising her to the pinnacle of political power, truly able to work for the betterment of the women of Turkey. But after just two and a half years, Atatürk divorced her and Hanım was forgotten and maligned. Public opinion became dominated by the image of a sharp-tongued, quarrelsome woman who strained Atatürk's nerves.

In the first biography to be written on Latife Hanım, İpek Çalışlar reveals an astonishing woman, ahead of her time.


The Arab uprisings have triggered different responses from the GCC states, ranging from anger at the collapse of the Mubarak regime in Egypt to direct intervention in Libya, and intensifying pressure for similar action in Syria. At the same time, the Gulf states have acted to minimise the consequences of these events within the region, intervening in Bahrain and either buying off or repressing signs of dissent elsewhere.

The contributors of this volume examine why these responses took the forms that they did and what pro-active initiatives have emerged in their wake to reinforce regional structures against the danger of contagion from the new uncertainties that have emerged in the Mashreq and the Maghreb. These range from the revival of the Arab League to proposals for the expansion and the integration of the GCC itself.


